Three Men Seeking Monsters: Six Weeks in Pursuit of Werewolves, Lake Monsters, Giant Cats, Ghostly Devil Dogs, and Ape-Men by Nick Redfern

Ken Atchity and Chi-Li Wong of AEI are producing the film adaptation of Nick Redfern's non-fiction book, "Three Men Seeking Monsters." David Hanson & George Zaloom (the writing team who recently finished the long-awaited sequel to "The Jerk") are on board to write the script. The movie is going to be a supernatural action-comedy in the tradition of "Ghostbusters." The project came to AEI after senior vice president of development Michael Kuciak read an excerpt of the book in Fortean Times, a British magazine devoted to the paranormal.

"Three Men Seeking Monsters" takes place in the summer of 2001. Professional monster hunters Nick Redfern, Jonathan Downes and Richard Freeman rent an RV and take to the road. Their adventures lead them deep into ancient forests, into the dark corridors of a mansion hiding a wild man, and to the shores of the legendary Loch Ness—along the way encountering all manner of curious characters, including witches, government agents, and eyewitnesses who claim to have seen monsters firsthand.

Nick says: "While we once thought that we lived in an orderly world, we now realize that orderly is the last thing that this world is. It is one filled with chaos, hidden realms, showy manipulators, dreams that may be real, a reality that may be all a dream, secret histories that some would have—and indeed, may have-killed to keep secret, bizarre characters and freaks of nature hidden, or hiding from prying eyes, a catalog of monsters, myths and mysteries that penetrate the heart of the British establishment and English folklore, and much, much more."

Nick Redfern is the author of many books including *Strange Secrets: Real Government Files on the Unknown*; *Celebrity Secrets: Official Government Files on the Rich and Famous*; and *Three Men Seeking Monsters: Six Weeks in Pursuit of Werewolves, Lake Monsters, Giant Cats, Ghostly Devil Dogs, And Ape-Men* – all published by Paraview Pocket Books, a division of Simon and Schuster.
